This year I'm going to give whitework a try. Within the whitework some of the different category, just types are... Hardanger, Richleau, most drawn thread work, darning, Borderie Anglaise, pattern Hedebo. Mountmellick, Reticella, Madeira, Ukrainian, and Schwalm. Whitework embroidery is one of the techniques employed in heirloom sewing for blouses, christening gowns, baby bonnets, monograms, and other small articles. The style is often regional that is developed over years. In the past, it was a way for women to bring income into their homes. You have to wonder how they did that without magnification, good light and find time from all their many duties of running a household.

Stay tuned! We may have some beginner Hardanger available for you to try out this fall. It is really pretty stuff!



Volunteer with DNTG at the Texas State Fair


